Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) Annual Report

Report for Financial Year 2016/17

1.0 Background

- 1.1 The Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) is a mechanism to allow local planning authorities to raise funds from new development, in order to contribute to the cost of infrastructure projects that are, or will be, needed to support new development.
- 1.2 The Community Infrastructure Levy Regulations 2010 (as amended) (Regulation 62) require a charging authority to prepare a report in specific items of CIL income and expenditure for each financial year. The report must be published by 31 December each year on the Borough Council's website. Parish and Town Councils must produce their own CIL reports (under Regulation 62A).
- 1.3 CIL took effect in Chesterfield Borough on all CIL-liable development which was granted from 1st April 2016. Therefore 2016/17 is the first financial year in which CIL has been charged and the first year in which CIL payments were collected. No expenditure took place in 2016/17 and therefore there is no expenditure to report. Future CIL expenditure will take place in accordance with a CIL Expenditure Strategy, to be considered by Cabinet in 2018. This will set out the approach which the Council will follow in identifying the specific items of infrastructure upon which CIL revenue should be spent in order to support growth and development across the Borough. In future reporting years where there are monies that have been spent/transferred, the AMR will set out the details:
- 1.4 CIL contributions only begin to be payable upon commencement of those CIL-liable schemes approved since 1st April 2016. There will inevitably be a time lag in this process. In the first year of the CIL scheme, CIL revenues have been received only from a very limited number of initial developments which were approved after 1st April 2016 and which have commenced on site. Table 1 below shows the CIL monies received in 2016/17 financial year.
