BOOK OF REMEMBRANCE



The Book of Remembrance is on view daily in a secure display cabinet in the new Remembrance Hall, close to the chapel. The Book is in four volumes, one for each quarter of the year, and bound in finest quality leather, richly tooled in gold. It has leaves of the finest hand made vellum. Each volume has a separate page for each day, and the pages are turned daily so that people may visit and see the entries for that day.

This is a simple, dignified and permanent memorial. Entries can be made at any time, even many years after death, and even for people whose funeral took place away from Chesterfield. The dates for inscriptions are usually the date of death, a birthday or wedding anniversary, but any other special date may be used.

Once the Book is filled it will be preserved and will always be available for reference at the Crematorium. Entries may also be viewed on the internet by visiting <http://chesterfield.bookofremembrance.eu/>

Inscriptions can consist of 2, 5 or 8 line entries. Each line must have 32 characters or less and badges, coats of arms, floral motifs etc. may be included with a 5 or 8 line entry at additional cost.

MEMORIAL CARDS AND BOOKS

The Joint Committee is aware that friends and relatives may wish to have a copy of the inscription as it appears in the Book of Remembrance, not only as a personal keep-sake, but also to send to those who cannot easily visit the Crematorium to view the original entry. For this purpose Memorial Cards and Books are available to order. The Card measures approximately 171mm by 124mm and is an exact replica of the entry in the Book of Remembrance.

Inscriptions in the Miniature Books and Cards are to the same high standard as the main Book, and contain beneath the anniversary date a copy of the original inscription as it appears in the Book. The Miniature Books have several pages so that future entries can be added to create a personal family record.

Entries of 2, 5 and 8 lines are available. With 5 and 8 line entries it is also possible to have a flower, picture, badge or motif entered alongside your inscription. Staff are available at the Crematorium Office to offer information and assistance. Please feel free to contact them for assistance in composing your inscription.
