It is an offence knowingly or recklessly to make a false statement in connection with an application and the maximum fine for which a person is liable on summary conviction for the offence is £5000.

GUIDANCE NOTES

IMPORTANT - PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

Please complete the Notice legibly in black ink or typed in a font of a size equal to or larger than 16 - the Notice is in a font of size 16.

The Notice must be of a size equal or larger than A4. This Notice is size A4.

The Notice must be printed on paper of a pale blue colour. This Notice is printed on paper of a pale blue colour.

The Notice must be displayed prominently at or on the premises to which the application relates where it can be conveniently read from the exterior of the premises and in the case of a premises covering an area of more than 50 square metres, a further Notice in the same form and subject to the same requirements must be displayed every 50 metres along the external perimeter of the premises abutting any highway.

The Notice must be kept on display for a period of no less than 28 consecutive days starting on the day after the day the application was given to the Council.

You are also required to publish the Notice in a local newspaper circulating in the vicinity of the premises on at least one occasion during the period of 10 working days starting on the day after the day on which the application was given to the Council.
