

State of the Borough 2026

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Introduction

A census has taken place in this country every ten years since 1801. The State of the Borough report draws mainly on data from the 2021 Census and provides a comprehensive collection of demographic information about the Borough of Chesterfield.

Comparisons are shown with Derbyshire County Council, the East Midlands and England and where possible at Ward Level. There are currently 19 wards in Chesterfield Borough.

Summary

The Borough of Chesterfield

N.B The summary below is based on the results of the 2021 Census. Ward boundaries for Chesterfield changed in 2023 following a review by the Local Government Boundary Commission. Chesterfield is the second largest settlement in Derbyshire (Derby City is the largest). It is a relatively compact and mainly urban area. It is well known for its Parish Church, with its Crooked Spire. The M1 runs by the Borough's eastern boundary, while to the north and west there are sizeable areas of open countryside which lie in the northeast Derbyshire Greenbelt. The Rother Valley runs from the south to the north through the Borough and contains many long-established industrial environments, railways and the Chesterfield canal.

The market town of Chesterfield acts as the sub-regional centre for north-eastern Derbyshire and provides a range of retail, commercial, leisure and cultural facilities. The town is well located on the edge of the Peak District National Park and benefits from easy access to the surrounding cities of Sheffield, Derby and Nottingham

Chesterfield is a major centre of employment (over 48,000 people work in the Borough) and attracts 21,000 in-bound commuters on a daily basis. Its employment catchment area covers a large part of the surrounding districts of Bolsover and North East Derbyshire, as well as drawing in people from Derbyshire Dales and Sheffield. Chesterfield is the most important source of employment for Chesterfield residents with almost 31,000 (or 64%) working in the borough and a further 17,000 travelling outside the area for work.

On Census day 2021 Chesterfield Borough had a population of 103,600, 200 less than on Census day 2011.

Staveley lies on the eastern side of the Borough, approximately five miles from Chesterfield Town Centre – it is linked to the M1 and Chesterfield by the A619. It has a population of around 18,500, in a number of neighbourhoods. The majority of its employment prior to 1993 was mining, iron and steel and the chemical industry. The closure of the collieries caused serious economic decline in Staveley but in recent years, the Council has invested heavily in the area. Brimington is located halfway between Chesterfield and Staveley on the A619. It has an estimated population of 10,200. It is essentially residential, with a central shopping area.

Demography

Density - Chesterfield is a predominantly urban area and therefore has a higher density of population than Derbyshire, the East Midlands and England. The higher densities border on the town centre (Rother, Brockwell and Holmebrook). Chesterfield was the only local authority area in the East Midlands to see its population decline in the 2021 census. The regional population increased by 7.7%, while the population of England increased by 6.6%. In 2021, Chesterfield was home to around 11.2 people per football pitch-sized piece of land. This area was among the top 35% most densely populated English local authority areas at the last census.

Age - The age range generally reflects the County average. Between the last two censuses, the average (median) age of Chesterfield increased by two years, from 42 to 44 years of age. This area had a higher average (median) age than the East Midlands as a whole in 2021 (41 years) and a higher average (median) age than England (40 years). The median age is the age of the person in the middle of the group, meaning that one half of the group is younger than that person and the other half is older. The number of people aged 65 to 74 years rose by around 2,000 (an increase of 19.5%), while the number of residents between 35 and 49 years fell by around 3,900 (17.0% decrease).

Ethnicity – the Borough has a higher proportion of residents from minority ethnic backgrounds than in Derbyshire, with the main populations in St. Leonards, St. Helen's, Holmebrook and Moor. In 2021, 1.4% of Chesterfield residents identified their ethnic group within the "Mixed or Multiple" category, up from 1.1% in 2011. The 0.4 percentage-point change was the largest increase among high-level ethnic groups in this area. Across the East Midlands, the percentage of people from "Mixed or Multiple ethnic groups" increased from 1.9% to 2.4%, while across England the percentage increased from 2.3% to 3.0%. In 2021, 95.5% of people in Chesterfield identified their ethnic group within the "White" category (compared with 96.5% in 2011), while 1.9% identified their ethnic group within the "Asian, Asian British or Asian Welsh" category (compared with 1.5% the previous decade). The percentage of people who identified their ethnic group within the "Black, Black British, Black Welsh, Caribbean or African" category increased from 0.8% in 2011 to 0.8% in 2021.

Religion - In 2021, 44.5% of Chesterfield residents reported having "No religion", up from 27.2% in 2011. The rise of 17.3 percentage points was the largest increase of all broad religious groups in Chesterfield. Across the East Midlands, the percentage of residents who described themselves as having "No religion" increased from 27.5% to 40.0%, while across England the percentage increased from 24.8% to 36.7%. In 2021, 47.7% of people in

Chesterfield described themselves as Christian (down from 63.8%), while 5.6% did not state their religion (down from 7.4% the decade before).

Country of Birth - In the latest census, around 97,000 Chesterfield residents said they were born in England. This represented 93.6% of the local population. The figure has decreased from just under 98,200 in 2011, which at the time represented 94.6% of Chesterfield's population. Scotland was the next most represented, with just over 800 Chesterfield residents reporting this country of birth (0.8%). This figure was down from just over 950 in 2011, which at the time represented 0.9% of the population of Chesterfield. The number of Chesterfield residents born in Poland rose from around 300 in 2011 (0.3% of the local population) to around 500 in 2021 (0.5%).

Climate Change

Chesterfield is already experiencing the impacts of a changing climate, and even in the most optimistic scenario, we should at least prepare for 'an increased chance of warmer, wetter winters and hotter, drier summers.'

In December 2015 a total of 196 parties originally adopted the Paris Agreement – a legally binding international treaty on climate change – which aims to 'hold the increase in the global average temperature to well below 2°C above pre-industrial levels.' However, should the global average temperature rise above the 1.5°C threshold, communities here in the UK and worldwide will face 'the risk of far more severe climate change impacts, including more frequent and severe droughts, heatwaves and rainfall'.

The Met Office 'provides essential climate information that is tailored to the local area and easy to use for climate risk assessments, developing adaptation plans and building climate resilience'. Understanding adaptation and resilience

Climate change adaptation means preparing and adjusting to the current and predicted changes in severe weather patterns, while resilience to climate change means preparing for the impacts of a changing climate and building our capacity to recover.

Ensuring we improve our understanding of adaptation and identify and embed adaptation measures within our direct and indirect services is a crucial next step for us and all other councils, as is, supporting residents to build resilience within their local communities. In recent years, heatwaves, flooding and storms have interrupted the delivery of council services and proved to be an added financial cost to already stretched resources.

The more we can adapt to the negative impacts of climate change now, the more benefits we will see in the near and far future. While we will all feel the pressure of a changing climate, sadly, some residents and communities will bear the strain on a much more damaging scale. Working with diverse local, regional and national partners to identify those most at risk and those most vulnerable will be a fundamental focus in the forthcoming years.

Sustainable Communities

Due to a marginal exceedance of the national Air Quality Standards we have declared an air quality management area. The Council also monitors for sulphur dioxide and particulate matter.

The Borough has 12 conservation areas and 244 listed buildings.

Accessible Communities

The Borough has a higher percentage (23.9%) of households with no access to a car or van than Derbyshire (17.2%), East Midlands (19.1%) and England (23.5%). The highest percentage (38.6%) is in Rother compared to just 11.9% in Walton.

The majority of Chesterfield Borough residents live within a 20-minute walk of essential services, including GPs, Pharmacies, Schools, Post Offices etc. (a significant percentage within 10 minutes).

Living Communities

Chesterfield has a considerably higher percentage of social housing (23.1%) than in Derbyshire, (15.3%) East Midlands (15.8%) and England (17.7%). The highest percentages are in Middlecroft and Poolsbrook. Chesterfield's housing offer is focused towards lower and middle market housing, with a smaller proportion of larger detached properties (24.7%) than the Derbyshire average (32.8%).

The Borough has a far lower percentage (62.9) of owner occupiers than in Derbyshire (70.5%). The highest percentages are in Walton (88.9%) and West (86.5%); the lowest percentages are in Middlecroft and Poolsbrook (41.9%), Rother (42.2%) and Holmebrook (43.9%).

The private rented sector appears to be continuing to grow rapidly with particular concentrations in Holmebrook and St. Helens.

Working and Learning Communities

Of Chesterfield residents aged 16 years and over, 54.2% said they were employed (excluding full-time students) in 2021, down from 54.6% in 2011. In 2021, just under 1 in 40 people (2.3%) said they were unemployed, compared with 4.2% in 2011. The percentage of retired Chesterfield residents increased from 25.1% to 25.7%. The decrease in the percentage of people aged 16 years and over (excluding full-time students) who were employed was greater across the East Midlands (1.0 percentage points, from 56.1% to 55.1%) than in Chesterfield (0.4 percentage points). Across England, the percentage fell by 0.8 percentage points, from 56.5% to 55.7%.

In 2021, 9.7% of Chesterfield residents aged 16 years and over and in employment said they worked 15 hours or less per week. This figure increased from 9.2% in 2011. In 2021, just over 1 in 11 people (9.4%) said they worked over 49 hours per week, compared with 11.2% in

2011. The percentage of adults in employment working 31 to 48 hours per week increased from 57.1% to 59.1%. The percentage of people aged 16 years and over and in employment who said they usually worked 15 hours or less per week remained 9.8% across the East Midlands. Across England, the percentage increased from 9.7% to 10.3%.

Please note: Census 2021 took place during the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, a period of rapid and unparalleled change; the national lockdown, associated guidance and furlough measures will have affected the labour market and our ability to measure it.

Safe, Healthy and Active Communities

Health - In 2021, 42.7% of Chesterfield residents described their health as "very good", increasing from 41.4% in 2011. Those describing their health as "good" rose from 34.4% to 34.6%. These are age-standardised proportions. The proportion of Chesterfield residents describing their health as "very bad" was 1.5% (similar to 2011), while those describing their health as "bad" fell from 6.0% to 5.4%.

Please note: Census 2021 was conducted during the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic. This may have influenced how people perceived and rated their health, and therefore may have affected how people chose to respond.

Dependent children - Of Chesterfield households, 18.1% included a couple but no children in 2021, down from 19.4% in 2011.

In 2021, just under one in six households (16.3%) included a couple with dependent children, compared with 18.2% in 2011. The percentage of single-family households including a couple living with only non-dependent children increased from 5.8% to 6.0%. The decrease in the percentage of households including a couple but no children in Chesterfield (1.3 percentage points) was similar to the decrease across the East Midlands (1.3 percentage points, from 19.5% to 18.2%). Across England, the percentage fell by 0.9 percentage points, from 17.6% to 16.8%.

Marital status - Of Chesterfield residents aged 16 years and over, 35.7% said they had never been married or in a civil partnership in 2021, up from 31.6% in 2011. In 2021, just over 4 in 10 people (43.5%) said they were married or in a registered civil partnership, compared with 47.1% in 2011. The percentage of adults in Chesterfield that had divorced or dissolved a civil partnership increased from 10.9% to 11.2%. The increase in the percentage of people aged 16 years and over who had never been married or in a civil partnership was greater in Chesterfield (4.2 percentage points) than across the East Midlands (3.8 percentage points, from 32.3% to 36.1%). Across England, the percentage increased by 3.3 percentage points, from 34.6% to 37.9%. These figures include same-sex marriages and opposite-sex civil partnerships in 2021, neither of which were legally recognised in England and Wales in 2011. Same-sex marriages have been legally recognised in England and Wales since 2014 and opposite-sex civil partnerships have been recognised since 2019.

Disability - In 2021, 9.9% of Chesterfield residents were identified as being disabled and limited a lot. This figure decreased from 11.6% in 2011. In 2021, around one in eight people

(12.5%) were identified as being disabled and limited a little, compared with 11.7% in 2011. The proportion of Chesterfield residents who were not disabled increased from 76.8% to 77.7%. The decrease in the proportion of residents who were identified as being disabled and limited a lot in Chesterfield (1.7 percentage points) was similar to the decrease across the East Midlands (1.6 percentage points, from 9.3% to 7.7%). Across England, the proportion fell by 1.6 percentage points, from 9.1% to 7.5%.

Life expectancy is 8.8 years lower for men and 7.4 years lower for women in the most deprived areas of Chesterfield than in the least deprived areas.

In Year 6, 21.1% of children are classified as obese, and 71.1% of adults are classified as overweight or obese. The rate of self-harm hospital stays, smoking related deaths and drug misuse are worse than average.

Index of Multiple Deprivation 2025

Chesterfield is the 80th most deprived area in England out of 298 English local authorities compared to 86 out of 319 in 2019. This places Chesterfield within the 27% most deprived authorities in England for both datasets.

Of the 17 local authorities (district and unitary) within the EMCCA area, Chesterfield Borough is ranked 6th most deprived for the overall indices of multiple deprivation. However, just 1 LSOA is in the 20 most deprived – Grangewood at number 17.

Sustainable Communities

Air Quality in Chesterfield

There is a duty placed on local authorities under the Environment Act 1995 to measure and record the levels of certain air pollutants within their borough. The results of the monitoring data are summarised in reports which are submitted to the Department of Environment, Food, and Rural Affairs (DEFRA) on an annual basis as part of the Review and Assessment process. If prescribed levels of certain pollutants are exceeded during the year there is a requirement on the council to make a more thorough assessment of pollutant levels at any air quality hotspots identified. The results of detailed assessments may indicate the need for the local authority to declare all or part of their borough as an Air Quality Management Area (AQMA). An action plan to tackle specific air quality problem areas must be produced within 12 months of an AQMA declaration. A marginal exceedance of the national Air Quality Standards was found to have occurred and, as such, we have declared an Air Quality Management Area. The Action Plan is currently being drafted.

Annual Data from Monitoring Stations

Pollutant concentrations are below the Air Quality Objectives (AQO) at all monitoring locations across the borough, the first time that this has been the case since 2011. We declared an Air Quality Management Area in Brimington, and as the monitoring results at this location have fluctuated around the AQO we do not intend to remove this declaration until we can be sure that the improvement is sustained. The long-term trend displays a reduction in the levels. PM₁₀, and Benzene levels are within the Air Quality Objective.

Nitrogen Dioxide (NO₂) Automatic Monitoring Data

Nitrogen Dioxide is monitored by the use of two Automatic Urban/Rural Network (AURN) affiliated sites. These automatically monitor for oxides of nitrogen and fine particulate materials, downloading data to a DEFRA operated database. This allows the gathering of near real-time pollution data. These sites also allow the co-location of diffusion tubes to validate monthly exposed diffusion tubes which are located at appropriate sites around the borough.

The health of people in Chesterfield is varied compared with the England average. About 19.6% (3,460) children live in low-income families. Life expectancy for both men and women is lower than the England average.

Health inequalities

Life expectancy is 8.8 years lower for men and 7.4 years lower for women in the most deprived areas of Chesterfield than in the least deprived areas.

Child health

In Year 6, 21.1% (249) of children are classified as obese. The rate for alcohol-specific hospital admissions among those under 18 is 59*, worse than the average for England. This represents 12 admissions per year. Levels of GCSE attainment (average attainment 8 score) and smoking in pregnancy are worse than the England average.

Adult health

The rate for alcohol-related harm hospital admissions is 1015*, worse than the average for England. This represents 1,070 admissions per year. The rate for self-harm hospital admissions is 498*, worse than the average for England. This represents 495 admissions per year. Estimated levels of excess weight in adults (aged 18+) are worse than the England average. The rates of new sexually transmitted infections, killed and seriously injured on roads and new cases of tuberculosis are better than the England average. The rates of violent crime (hospital admissions for violence) and under 75 mortality rate from cancer are worse than the England average.

Chesterfield's Health Index score decreased in 2021.

Chesterfield has an overall Health Index score of 95.1, which is down 1.6 points compared with the previous year.

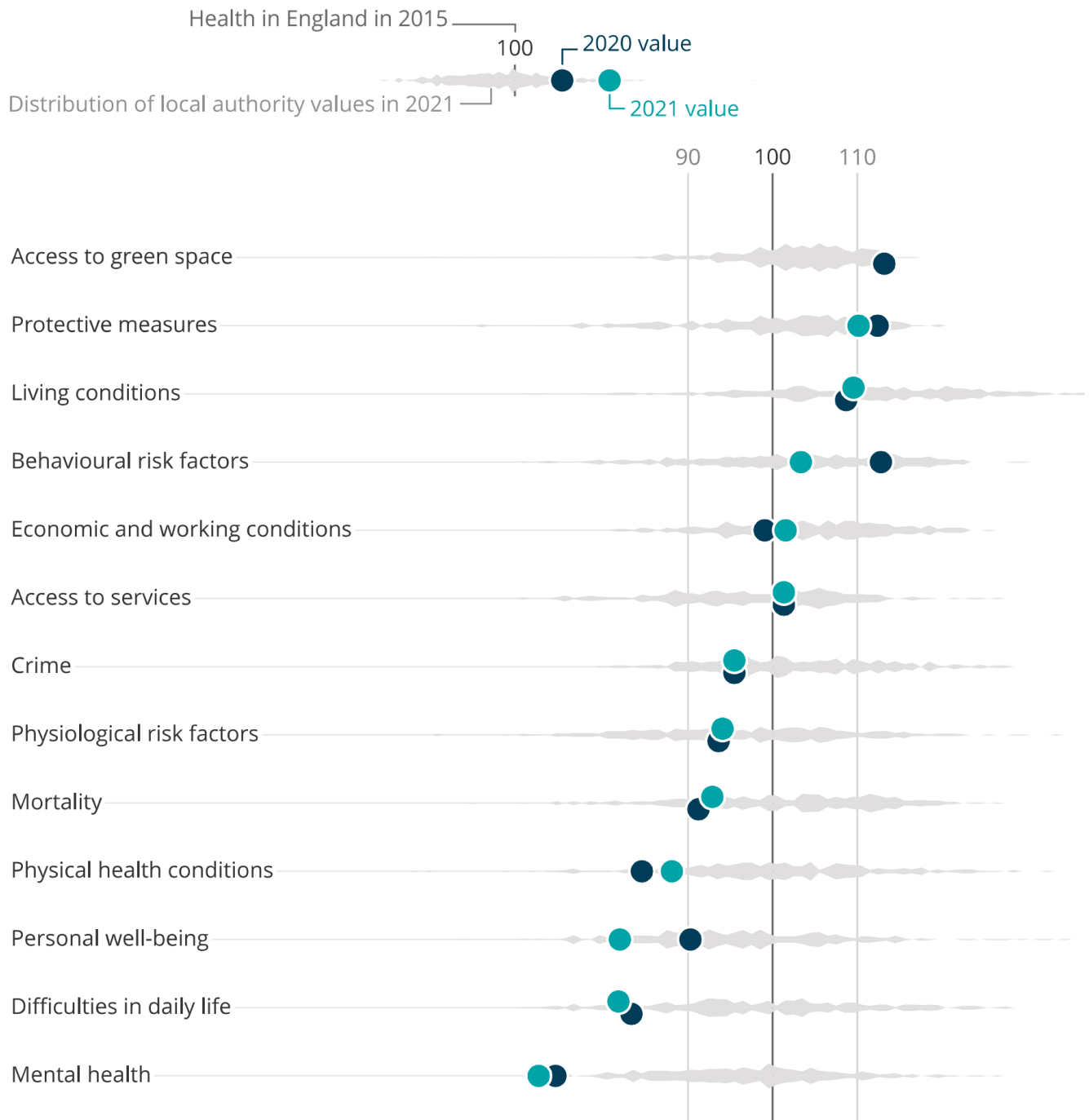
The ONS have created an index that gives every local area in England an overall health score for each of the past six years. This overall score is made up of measures in different categories, called domains and subdomains. These measures include physical and mental health conditions like diabetes or anxiety, local unemployment, road safety, and behaviours like healthy eating.

A score of 100 represents average levels of health in England in 2015. A higher number always means better health and a lower number means worse health.

Chesterfield ranked in the bottom 30 percent of local authority areas in England for health in 2021.

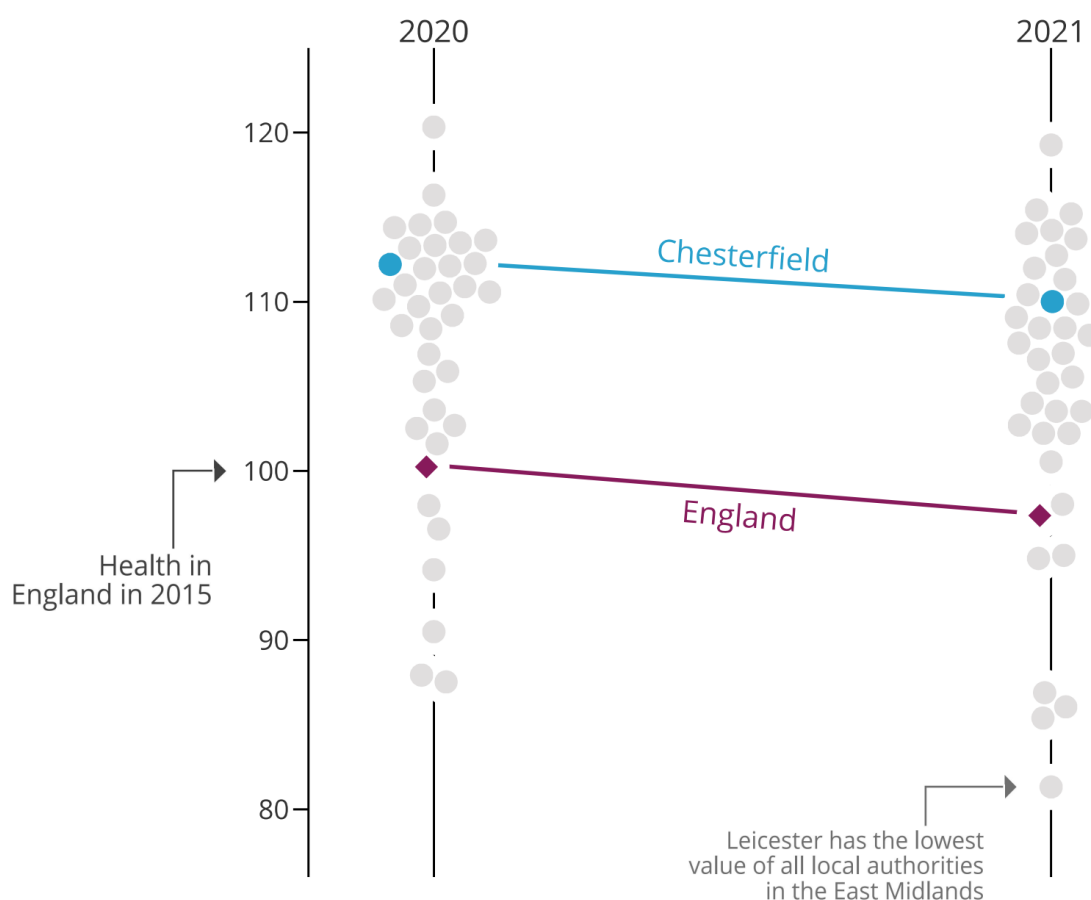

- Other local authorities in the East Midlands

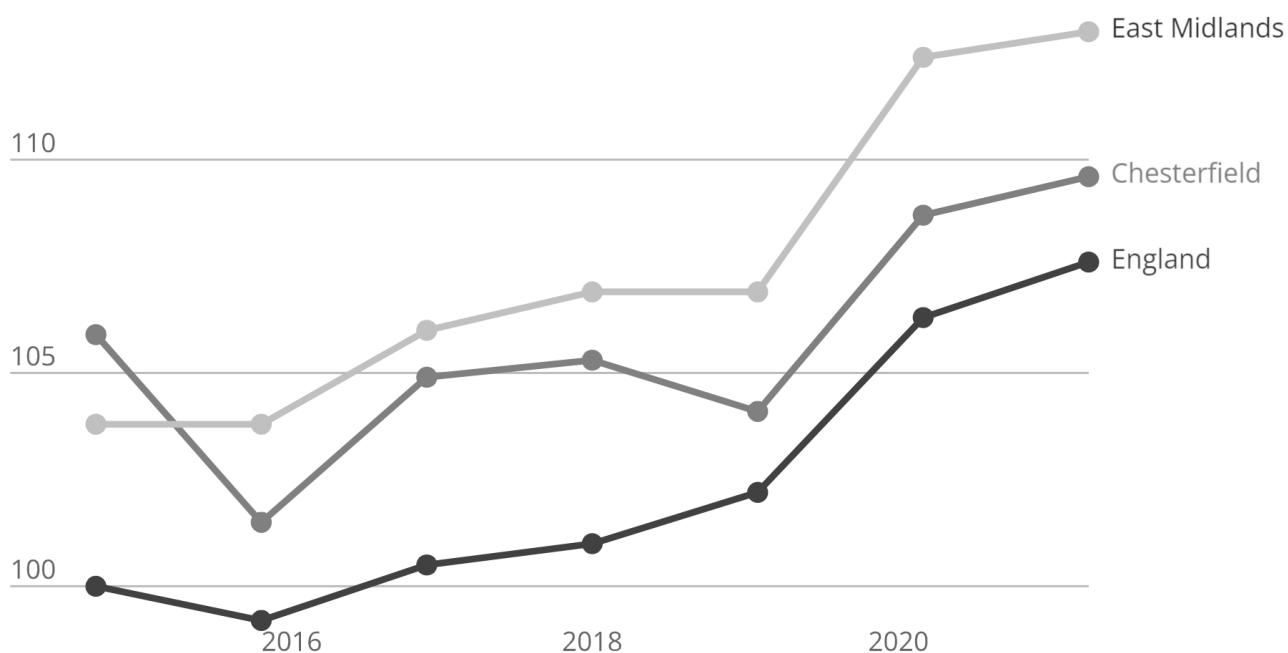

“Protective measures” addresses cancer screening attendance and child vaccination coverage. Chesterfield’s score for “protective measures” fell from 112.4 in 2020 to 110.2 in 2021. Despite the decrease, Chesterfield remained in the top 20% of local authority areas across England for this subdomain.

The change was largely because of a worsening in cancer screening attendance (a decrease of 8.6).

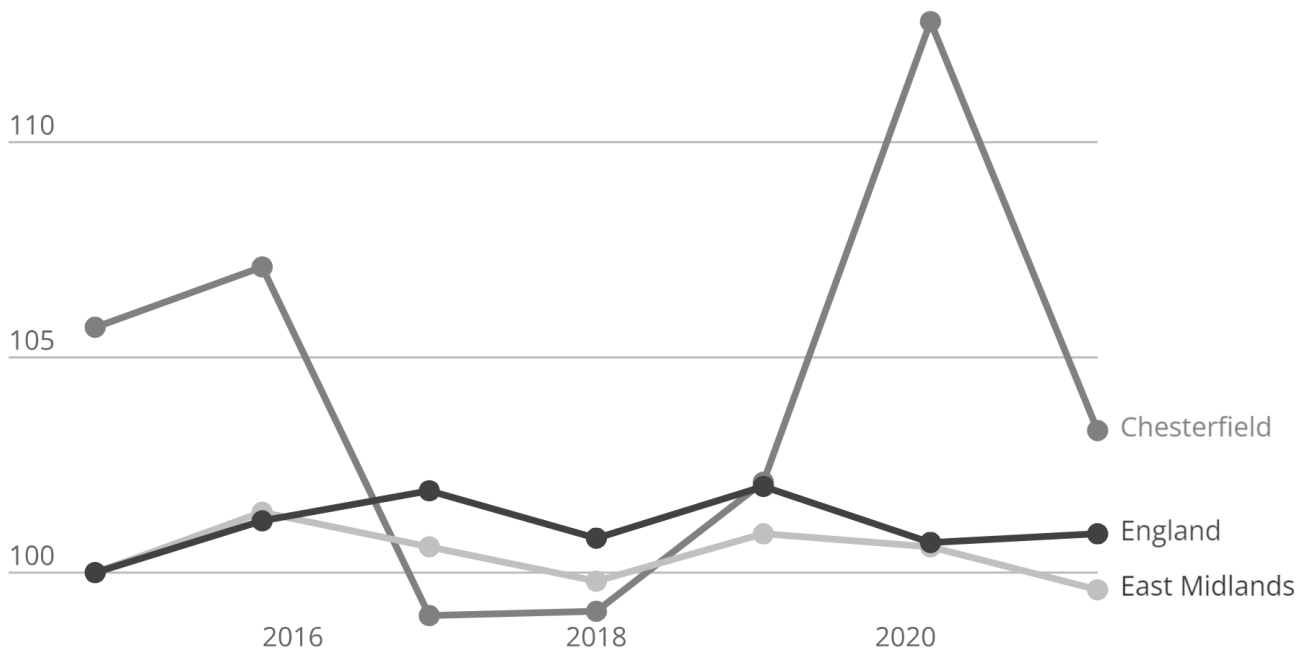
"Living conditions" looks at air pollution, household overcrowding, noise complaints, road safety, and rough sleeping.

Between 2015 and 2021, Chesterfield's Health Index value for "living conditions" went from 105.9 to 109.6. Despite the increase, Chesterfield went from being in the top 40% of local authority areas to being close to average for this subdomain.

The change was largely because of a decrease in household overcrowding (the index improved by 21.4 points) and a decrease in air pollution (the index improved by 13.7 points). However, there was also an increase in rough sleeping (the index worsened by 24.5 points).

"Behavioural risk factors" addresses alcohol misuse, drug misuse, healthy eating, physical activity, sedentary behaviour, sexually transmitted infections, and smoking.

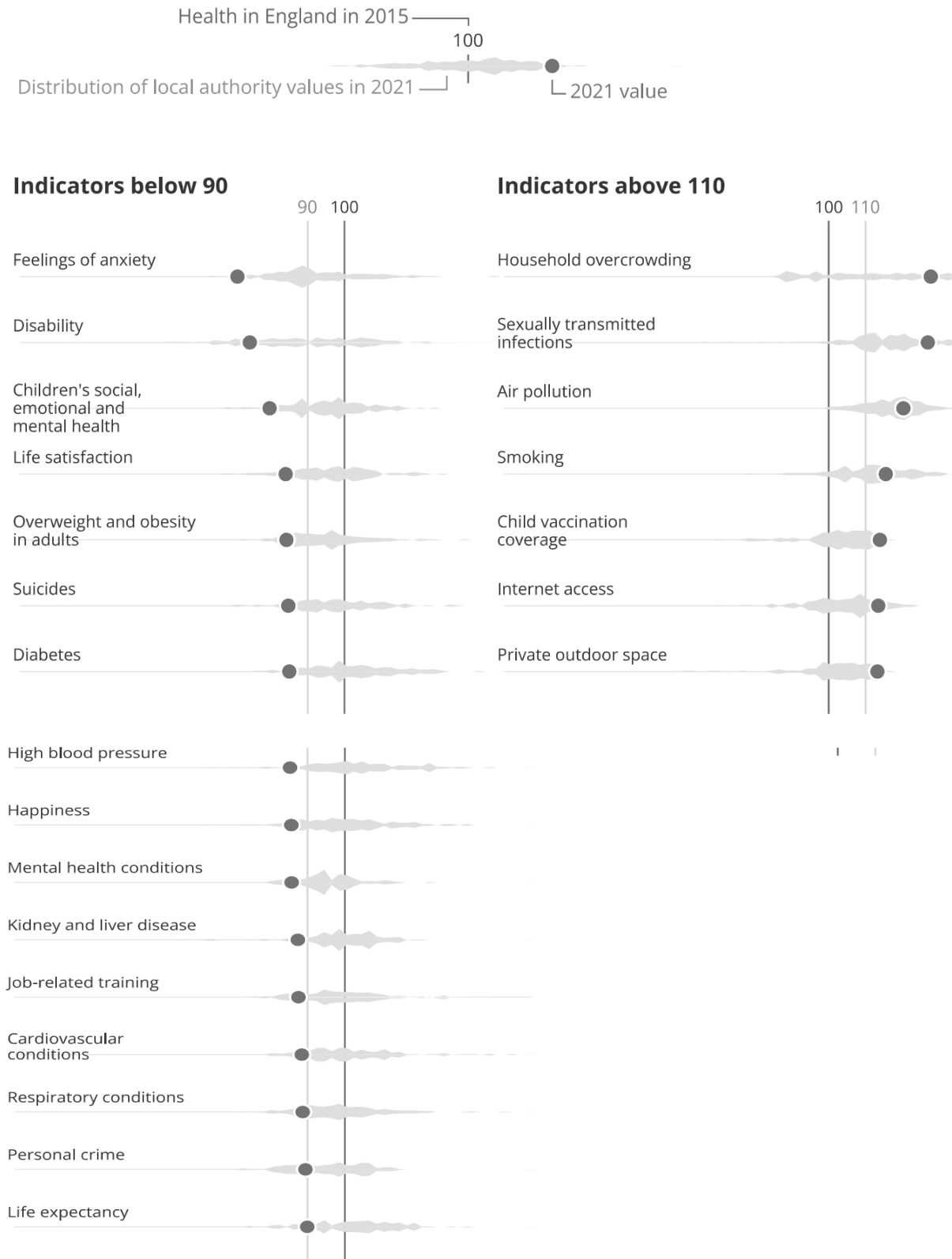
Drug and alcohol misuse are difficult to measure as both can be hidden behaviours. Drug misuse is measured through drug-related crime. For alcohol misuse, we count hospital admissions. A fall in reports of crime or hospital admissions during the pandemic may not represent an actual decrease in alcohol or drug misuse.

Chesterfield's score for "behavioural risk factors" fell from 105.7 in 2015 to 103.3 in 2021. This means Chesterfield went from being among the best 40% of local authority areas to being close to average across England for this subdomain.

The change was largely because of a worsening in physical activity (a decrease of 11.0) and an increase in sedentary behaviour (the index worsened by 7.8 points).

Chesterfield's lowest indicator score is for feelings of anxiety and its highest score is for household overcrowding.

Index of Multiple Deprivation 2025

The 2025 Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) was released in the Autumn of 2025.

The methodology for developing the IMD was reviewed in 2022. This led to an increase in background indicators from 39 in 2019 to 55 in 2025. Some of the previous indicators have also been extensively modified. Updates and changes to methodology and datasets comes at the expense of 'backwards' comparability with previous versions of the Indices.

In addition, since 2019 there has been a reduction in the number of authorities within the IMD – 319 in 2019 to 298 in 2025. This is due to local government reorganisation in several areas including Buckinghamshire, Cumbria, Northamptonshire, Somerset and North Yorkshire. The 2019 rankings have been included within this briefing for context, however, for the reasons noted above, should not be used in direct comparison.

As well as local authority level, data is also available for lower super output areas (LSOAs). LSOAs are small areas designed to be of a similar population size, with an average of approximately 1,500 residents or 650 households. They were produced by the Office for National Statistics for the reporting of small area statistics. Following the 2021 Census, the geography of LSOA was revised and the number of areas has increased from 32,844 (as used for the Indices of Deprivation 2015 and 2019) to 33,755 (as used for the Indices of Deprivation 2025) however, the number and boundaries of LSOAs in Chesterfield Borough remain the same.

Please note, for the tables that follow:

- The lower the rank and score – the higher the level of deprivation
- Ranks are converted into deciles – decile 1 indicates that the area is within the 10% most deprived in England and decile 10 within the 10% least deprived
- Rounding is used so percentages will not always add to 100%

Indices of multiple deprivation – key messages

- Chesterfield Borough Council is currently ranked 80 out of 298 authorities compared to 86 out of 319 in 2019. This places Chesterfield within the 27% most deprived authorities in England for both datasets
- Of the 17 local authorities (district and unitary) within the EMCCA area, Chesterfield Borough is ranked 6th most deprived for the overall indices of multiple deprivation. However, just 1 LSOA is in the 20 most deprived – Grangewood at number 17
- At a Derbyshire level - In 2019 Chesterfield Borough has the 2nd lowest rank for IMD with Bolsover having the 1st lowest and Derby having the 3rd. In 2025 Chesterfield and Derby have swapped so Chesterfield Borough has the 3rd lowest ranking. 2 Chesterfield LSOAs are in the 20 most deprived for IMD in Derbyshire – Grangewood which is ranked 8th and Holmehall which is ranked 14th
- In 2019, 6 of Chesterfield’s 69 LSOAs were in decile 1 for IMD compared to 8 in 2025. The 6 areas in 2019 – Grangewood (improved position), Holmehall (declining position), Barrow Hill (declining position), St. Augustines (declining position), Poolsbrook (declining position and Middlcroft Central (improved position) continue to be in decile 1 in 2025, 2 additional areas Mastin Moor and Old Whittington East have moved from decile 2 to decile 1
- Across the 20% most deprived area the position is however improving with 29% of Chesterfield LSOAs being in decile 1 and 2 in 2019 compared to 25% in 2025. Overall, 55% of Chesterfield LSOAs have an improved rank between 2019 and 2025 for IMD. 19% have improved their decile and 19% a declining decile
- The overall IMD measure is a blend of the core domain indices. The overall IMD score has been significantly impacted by two declining domains Crime and Living environment. There has been a significant fall in rank and decile across the majority of the borough for these two domains – further analysis is required to understand that position.

Income deprivation – key messages

- Chesterfield Borough Council is currently ranked 87 out of 298 authorities compared to 64 out of 319 in 2019. In 2025 this places Chesterfield within the 29% most deprived authorities in England compared to 20% in 2019
- Of the 17 local authorities (district and unitary) within the EMCCA area, Chesterfield Borough is ranked 6th most deprived for income deprivation. However, no Chesterfield LSOAs are in the 20 most deprived for the EMCCA area
- At a Derbyshire level - In 2019 Chesterfield Borough has the 2nd lowest rank for income deprivation with Bolsover having the 1st lowest and Derby having the 3rd. In 2025 Derby has the lowest ranking, followed by Bolsover and then Chesterfield. Just 1 Chesterfield LSOA is in the 20 most deprived for income in Derbyshire – Grangewood ranked at 19th
- In 2019, 7 of Chesterfield’s 69 LSOAs were in decile 1 for income deprivation compared to 6 in 2025.
