# Who we are

- Community Charter Standard Football Club with 24 junior teams, U21, 2 senior mens and a senior ladies football team.
- Approximately 350 playing members, plus supporters and family members.
- Lease on site at Inkersall Road (main ground) plus lease on pitches on Chantry Road (primarily used by juniors).
- Seniors currently playing at Step 6 of the football pyramid and Step 7 football also for U21 and junior football progression
- Target of reaching to 500-children playing football at Staveley MWFC

# What we had v what we now have



- Original grass pitch and floodlights erected in 1993
- In 2007 the football club was going to be closed down
- ▶ I took the reins as Chairman in 2007 with just 2 teams
- In 2011 formed a Staveley MWFC Juniors Section
- In 2020 Grants secured for £721,327 from Football Foundation, Premier League and Viridor.
- We now have a Step 6 and 7 teams in the national league pyramid, U21/U19/U18 and Ladies first team, U18 and a total of 24 teams (20 boys and 4 girls teams)
- Crowds at first team games in 2007 averaged 45, 2023 now average just shy of 250.

















### Staveley Town Fund- Accelerator Fund

£150,000 towards new drainage and pitch improvement works to Chantry Car Park. Project was completed by the end of March 2021.

Has provided a huge increase in the number of training sessions and game time for the Juniors

Will enhance the health and well being of the children

Will increase use of the ground which previously suffered from water logging, poor conditions.









- Redevelopment of Car park opposite Chantry Park
  - Removal of trees to open up the site
  - Levelling and resurfacing of the existing ground
- Improve safety and security for users of Chantry and Poolsbrook Country Park.
- Key outcomes will include:
  - Reduction in crime carried out in car park
  - Reduction in illegal parking on main road (and time savings for local police)
  - Improved security for users of the car park
  - Safe crossing for users of the car park















- Our second Grant ask is for the Creation of an education and training rooms at Inkersall Road.
- To provide opportunity for young people to remain in education in the local community.
- Initial cohort of 20 boy students (year 1) progressing to 60 total per annum by year 5 with both boys and girls.
- Opportunity for employment within football club, football facility or potentially local businesses.
- Ability to run afterschool / homework club for disadvantaged young people from the site linked to sporting provision.
- Targeting non-football activities dance classes/chess clubs/health and safety classes - very much a wide audience.

This is the first time a new 16-19 provider has ever achieved the top grade in all three themes. The report has been published by Ofsted today (5th November 2021), based on an inspection carried out on 13th and 14th October 2021.
- VLUK began a direct contract with the Education and Skills Funding Agency (ESFA) in 2019 for 16-19 study programmes and this is the first time Ofsted has visited its campuses. The judgement recognises that VLUK is making 'Significant Progress' in; designing and delivering relevant education programmes; providing quality teaching and learning experiences; and keeping learners safe. Ofsted specifically recognised the work done by the VLUK Leadership, stating: "'They have meticulously designed the curriculum so that learners swiftly develop the skills, knowledge and professional behaviours they need for higher education and employment".
- A New Provider Monitoring Visit (NPMV) is carried out by Ofsted within 3 years of a direct contract being awarded. It assesses the progress being made towards a full inspection.

#### Why VLUK Staveley MWFC Campus?

Our education courses will be held in a £2M new construction build with facilities therein sited adjacent to a recently installed FIFA quality pro 3G artificial surface. Students will not be expected to flit from classroom to sports facilities as they are as one here.

An air conditioned new build with student learning in 3 separated classrooms the environment being created is one of 'student priority' with safety and security being a key aspect of the facilities we provide as a football club and imminently as and education base is always our priority.

Having nearly 30-teams in our club, there are opportunities for boys and girls to play U19/21 and Step 7 and ultimately Step 6 football where youth development is our number one aim.

The community football club is here to serve those within it. Our ethos is about the "Community" and seeing local teenagers join our education course as we set about "life learning" within their educational time on our courses. It is about the club serving those using it.





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# Land Ownership



- Concerns car park lease and financial shortfall Staveley Town Council own the front car park. In 2020 as part of the Football Foundation and Premier League financial and legal due diligence, the project proceeded with the car park owned but subject to the Staveley Town Council having agreed a 25-year licence/lease subject to final negotiations on terms and conditions and that there was a proposed 2-year break Clause.
- The Staveley Miners Welfare in 1934 bought 5.79 hectares of land from the Chatsworth Estates Company for 572 pounds & a few shillings
- The land that was purchased included the car park area to the Inkersall Rd boundary.

- The project has planning permission from the Chesterfield Borough Council
- Building Regulation Approval is being sought and will be submitted within the next 2 weeks.
- We are preparing in conjunction with Chesterfield Borough Council Procurement Invitations To Tender for the 9 separate works packages plus the appointment of a Principal Contractor to coordinate the works.
- The intended programme of works is set out below.



# Summary

- The project is a further enhancement in my vision to secure a self sustainable Community Football Club where local boys and girls at 16-18 year old can further educate whilst seeing local children and adults play for this club at all levels.
- Where other local groups of non-sporting basis can use the facility also. We have seen Derbyshire FA Referees boost their numbers by hosting scores of courses at the club with a further separate class roomed area above the existing current on-going facilities that are not compromised. This is a wide visioned project to target so many differing Groups.
- ▶ I have been successful in pursuing and securing £721,000 + £150,000 £160,000 + hopefully the circa £600,000 for this project cumulating to some £1.65M for the benefit of the people and Community of Staveley.
- ▶ I hope the Staveley Town Deal Board will support and sign off this project ask.
