NOTICE OF PROPOSAL TO EXTEND THE PUBLIC SPACES PROTECTION ORDER CHESTERFIELD (NO 2) 2017

TAKE NOTICE that Chesterfield Borough Council has extended the Public Spaces Protection Order Chesterfield (No 2) 2017 ("the No 2 2017 Order") for a period of 3 years commencing on 15 December 2020. The other terms of the No 2 2017 Order remain unchanged. The extension order is titled the Public Spaces Protection Order Chesterfield (No 2) 2017 Extension Order 2020 ("the No 2 Extension Order 2020).

The No 2 2017 Order applies to public places in the Chesterfield town centre area and contains a number of prohibitions and requirements relating to tents (and other temporary structures); persons causing nuisance, alarm, harassment or distress; loitering and begging; urination and defecation; unattended material and paraphernalia; and intoxicating substances.

It is an offence if a person, without reasonable excuse, fails to comply with any of the prohibitions or requirements of the No 2 2017 Order and such a person, if convicted of an offence, is liable to a fine not exceeding £1000; alternatively, an authorised person (a Police Constable, Police Community Support Officer or an authorised Council officer) may issue a Fixed Penalty Notice of £100.
