**NOTICE OF MAKING OF THE
PUBLIC SPACES PROTECTION ORDER
(DOG CONTROL) 2021**

TAKE NOTICE that the Public Spaces Protection Order (Dog Control) 2021 (“the Order”) was made on 16 August 2021 and comes into effect on 20 August 2021 for a period of 3 years.

The Order contains provisions about dog fouling, dogs on leads, dogs on leads by direction and the exclusion of dogs. It is an offence if a person in charge of a dog without reasonable excuse (or unless consent has been given or an exemption applies), contravenes the provisions contained in the Order and such a person, if convicted of an offence, is liable to a fine not exceeding level 3 on the standard scale (currently £1,000); alternatively, an authorised person may issue a Fixed Penalty Notice of £80.

The restricted areas of land to which the provisions in the Order apply are specified in the Order.

Any person who lives in the restricted areas or who regularly works in or visits that area or areas may apply to the High Court to question the validity of the Order within the period of 6 weeks beginning with the date the Order was made. Restricted area means the land designated in the Schedules attached to this Order and being within the administrative area of Chesterfield Borough Council.
